School Hours

Cross Creek school-based programming will be offered from 9:00 am to 3:30 pm Monday through Friday.

Outpatient Counseling will be available until 8:00 pm on certain days during the week.

Transportation

Unless otherwise specified, your home school district will provide transportation to and from school. Questions regarding transportation should be directed to the contact person in your home district.

Lunch

Students will have the option to bring their own lunch or buy a box lunch provided by the Worthington City School District. Box lunches meet or exceed state guidelines for school lunches. The cost of a box lunch is \$2.25. Students who qualify for free or reduced lunches at their home school will also qualify at Cross Creek. Please contact your home district in order to receive an application.

Cost

The cost for treatment can be funded through self-pay, Medicaid, ADAMH public dollars, and insurance.

Cross Creek Day Treatment Program

The Cross Creek Day Treatment Program is a collaborative effort between the Franklin County ESC and The Buckeye Ranch.

The goal of the program is to provide a safe and positive environment for youth in which they can continue to learn to have a greater sense of pride in themselves, to take more responsibility for their behavior, to cooperate with others and learn appropriate problem solving skills and to focus on how they affect others in their lives.

The program offers students:

- Flexible special education and regular education classes,
- Classes that are tailored to meet the needs of middle and high school aged youth who are experiencing psychological difficulty and are exhibiting behavior problems,
- The ability for students to transition to their home school districts with support services.

The program is conveniently located in Worthington at the site of the former Harding Hospital and supports many suburban school districts in Franklin and surrounding counties.

Franklin County Educational Service Center

The mission of the Franklin County Educational Service Center is to provide quality services that enhance learning. In serving school districts so they may better serve students, the FCESC provides numerous services from classroom instruction, business and fiscal as well as related services.

The Franklin County Educational Service Center directly serves the Canal Winchester, Groveport-Madison, Hamilton and Plain (New Albany) Local School Districts.

The Center also has specialized service contracts with Bexley, Dublin, Gahanna-Jefferson, Grandview Heights, Hilliard, Reynoldsburg, South-Western, Upper Arlington, Westerville, Whitehall and Worthington City School Districts.

In accordance with Ohio Revised Code, one of the basic and most fundamental functions of the FCESC is to assist with the administrative and service functions for these school districts. Accordingly, funds and personnel serve this primary purpose.

In addition, as a regional service center, we proudly serve many needs of sixteen school districts throughout central Ohio and provide a valuable, cost-effective program to deploy services to students and schools in the highest quality means possible.

The Buckeye Ranch

For over forty years, The Buckeye Ranch has offered hope and healing to children and families struggling with emotional, behavioral and mental health issues. Our mission is to provide hope for children and families, support communities through prevention, family-based care and research.

The Ranch's comprehensive continuum of care encompasses:

- residential care
- foster care
- child welfare
- community-based programs such as outpatient and case management services.

Every day, nearly 2,000 children and families are served by the Ranch, which has eight locations throughout Ohio.

Currently, there are a lack of options for at-risk, high needs adolescent who struggle in the traditional school setting. The Ranch's Cross Creek Program provides an enriching academic setting while addressing the behavioral barriers to learning that have confounded school districts, children and their families.
